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A INSTRUCTIVE TEXT

DÉFINITION → An instructive text is a text that **instructs** or tells you **how** to do something. A recipe instructs you to cook something.

A leaflet with a piece of furniture tells you how to put it together or take care of it.

Instructive texts:

- Are written as if the reader is being spoken to (although the word 'you' is not usually used).
- Language is direct and unnecessary words are left out.
- Often use 'must' and 'must not'.
- Sometimes use diagrams or pictures to help understanding.

STRUCTURE → The main structure of a prescriptive text is:

Short introduction + Sequence of Instructions

EXAMPLE OF INSTRUCTIVE TEXT.-Recipe First you have to mix the flour, sugar, milk, oil and vanilla **Apple Pie Recipe** very well without lumps. - Then break the eggs. Ingredients: 500 grams of apples, - Make a hole in the centre of the mix and put butter and 100 grams of butter or margarine, the eggs two eggs, 8 spoonfuls of wheat or - After making that, mix all the ingredients together. corn flour, 2 sugar tablespoons, 1 - Take a mould, spread butter on it and put inside the vanilla spoonful (best if it's royal), mixture. half a litre of milk, marmalade and - Slice the apples (shaped like crisps but thicker) an envelope of a product called: - Put them inside a pan and boil them with water and Flanin (but you can also make egg custards). - Once you boil them, on the mix that you've done before, put one layer of apples. - Add the Flanin on the apple layer. **Preparation**: 20 minutes. - Next, add another apple layer with spiral shape. - Put the mould inside the oven and when the pie is nearly Portions: 6 finished, add the marmalade. - The temperature depends on the oven.
